#### **AGM**

The first AGM was held on 10<sup>th</sup> October. 19 people attended, which was a pretty poor showing since it included jean ainsley our accountant and shauna cameron and paul keegan, our architects.

The memorandum of association and charitable status of the company, and terms of the lease of the Drill Hall were explained.

Mention was made of generous donations made by Leslie and Alma Wolfson (£100) and Malcolm and Norma Gibson (£200, in memory of Sharon). It was generally agreed that the latter should be put toward something permanent, say a window in the refurbished hall.

Shauna Cameron outlined some provisional ideas for refurbishing the Drill Hall, and it was explained that we planned to skip the tight deadline for SCVO funding on 31<sup>st</sup> October, and instead put together a good proposal for the next and final round of funding in 6 months time.

It was agreed that the chairman of the Residents Association would be invited to attend meetings of the Directors in order to enhance the flow of information and feedback to and from the Company.

#### **CADISPA**

CADISPA is a project based at the University of Strathclyde which examines communities and projects such as ours from an academic and sociological viewpoint, and can also assist us in directing future strategy for the Drill Hall funding and any other projects that the Trust may take up in the future. Geoff Fagan the project manager came to stay on 30<sup>th</sup> October and we have now officially invited CADISPA to be involved. We feel they have something to offer from their past and ongoing experience of similar projects. They should be able to point us in the direction of any available finance, and also as outside observers help to keep us on track in following our own objectives.
